

Did You Know...


According to a popular Halloween folklore, if you see a spider on Halloween, it could actually be the spirit of a loved one watching over you.

What's on the Menu

Peanut Butter No Bakes

A no-bake recipe that has yet to fail!

- » 2 cups sugar
- » 2 tablespoons butter
- » 1/2 cup milk

Stir the above ingredients together in a deep microwave safe bowl and microwave for 5 minutes, then add:

- » 1/2 cup peanut butter
- » 1 teaspoon vanilla
- » 3 cups quick cooking oats

Quickly drop by tablespoons onto waxed paper to cool and set. Store in an airtight container (if they last that long!)
