

What's on the Menu

Old Fashioned Applesauce Cake

This super soft, fluffy and moist cake, which is similar to carrot cake, however with a light apple flavor and plenty of autumn spices is the perfect cake to enjoy this time of year! Besides who can resist a simple, flavorful, home-style cake just like your grandma would have made?

Ingredients

- » 2 cups sugar
- » 1/2 cup shortening
- » 2 eggs
- » 1-1/2 cup applesauce
- » 2 teaspoons vanilla
- » 1/2 cup water
- » 2-1/2 cup allpurpose flour
- » 1-1/2 teaspoons baking soda
- » 1-1/2 teaspoons salt
- » 1/4 teaspoon baking powder

- » 3/4 teaspoon cinnamon
- » 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- » 1/2 teaspoon allspice
- » 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- Garnish with powdered sugar, whipped cream, cinnamon.
 Or you may frost with cream cheese frosting if desired.



Beat sugar and shortening with an electric mixer; beat in eggs, applesauce, vanilla and water. Gradually add flour, baking soda, salt, baking powder and spices. Mix thoroughly then stir in walnuts. Pour batter into a greased and floured 13"x9" baking pan and bake at 350 degrees for one hour, or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean; watch that edges don't get too dark. Garnish with powdered sugar, whipped cream and cinnamon.














A Letter From the North Pole
